Dear Secretary Noem and Acting Director Lyons:

I am writing to respectfully urge the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) to increase federal law enforcement resources in Atlanta, Georgia, to protect citizens against record levels of illegal immigrants and to confront safety concerns.

Thanks to the leadership of President Trump and the tireless efforts of your departments, our southern border remains secure, with apprehensions at their lowest level in fifty years. While this represents a landmark achievement for our country, significant work remains, especially in the state of Georgia. According to one report, nearly 500,0000 illegal aliens are living in Georgia. That represents a 45% increase since 2018 in the number of people in Georgia living in open defiance of the law. Every single person who is here illegally has broken the law and must be treated accordingly; anything less invites a culture of not just mass illegal immigration, but mass crime.

Rising levels of illegal immigrants and increasing threats to public safety in Georgia highlight the urgent need for an enhanced ICE presence in Atlanta. Recently, ICE arrested Salvador Rodriguez-Mendoza, a criminal illegal alien from Mexico with an active arrest warrant for murder and two counts of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon by the Clayton County Sheriff's Office. Additionally, earlier this year in Atlanta, a mother of five children was brutally murdered by a criminal illegal alien from Honduras. Without the increased assistance of federal agents with local law enforcement, more of these criminals will be emboldened to commit crimes and will never face justice. Residents are clamoring for additional federal support, which would greatly assist state and local partners in maintaining public safety and ensuring that immigration laws are properly upheld.

Thank you for your attention to this matter and for your continued commitment to public safety and removing criminals from our streets. I look forward to working with your departments to make Georgia and our nation safer.
