Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro,

I am requesting funding for the Savannah Harbor Deepening Study in Fiscal Year 2026. The entity to receive funding for this project is the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The funding would be used for a study to define the optimal dimensions of the Harbor in a potential future improvement program, balancing cost-benefit for the nation, and environmental impact. The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because Savannah Harbor improvements will benefit the nation, not just Georgia, and keep pace with the global shipping industry's future ships. Enhancing the channel would not only allow larger, more cost-effective and sustainable vessels to call on Savannah. Addressing impediments to larger ships at the Port of Savannah will allow carriers to deploy 18,000- to 24,000-TEU vessels to the entire U.S. East Coast. Each ship could take on more cargo and transit the channel more quickly, getting U.S. exports to global markets with greater efficiency, lower cost and lower emissions. Modernizing the shipping channel will expedite the flow of cargo for mega-ships transiting the Savannah River. American exporters will have greater opportunity to move goods overseas, because ships will be able to take on more cargo.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized by Section 1202 of the Water Resources Development Act of 2024 (P.L. 118-272).
