



SCHUMER SHUTDOWN 2.0

If Senate Democrats fail to pass key funding bills by January 30, 2026, a partial federal government shutdown would disrupt services, delay pay, and stall critical programs that directly affect Georgia families, workers, servicemembers, and communities.

Here's who stands to lose in the second Schumer shutdown:

HEALTH, EDUCATION, & WORKFORCE

- Threatens funding disruptions for **Head Start programs** serving low-income Georgia families, affecting early childhood education and childcare access.
- Delays **HBCU funding**, impacting institutions that serve thousands of Georgia students.
- Disrupts **CDC operations**, including staffing and program disruptions, affecting disease monitoring, emergency response, and public health research.
- Stalls **primary care funding** and implementation of the Make America Healthy Again (MAHA) agenda, particularly impacting underserved areas across Georgia.
- Interrupts **Job Corps centers** that provide job training and housing for at-risk youth.
- Halts **charter school funding**.
- Pauses **Special Olympics** funding.
- Slows the **Social Security Administration** processing.

TRANSPORTATION & HOUSING

- Requires **Air Traffic Controllers** to work without pay, impacting the safety of domestic/international airplanes for the second time in four months.
- Strains **FAA operations** and safety oversight.
- Delays the **Federal Housing Administration (FHA)** loan processing, impacting homebuyers.
- Slows the **National Transportation Safety Board** investigations and safety work.

NATIONAL SECURITY & GLOBAL HEALTH

- Delays critical **U.S. support programs** for allies, including Israel.
- Interrupts **global health programs** addressing disease and humanitarian crises.

FINANCIAL SERVICES & SMALL BUSINESS

- Delays \$80.8 million in funding for the **Federal Election Commission**, critical to ensuring election integrity ahead of an instrumental midterm election.
- Compromises the election security of **Election Assistance Commission** operations by delaying about \$69 million in grants.
- Slows consumer **Product Safety Commission** enforcement and recalls.
- Impacts **Small Business Administration** loan processing, hurting entrepreneurs and local employers in Georgia who make long-term business decisions.
