6 et seq.) is amended by inserting after section 310 the fol7 lowing:

8 "SEC. 310A. PROHIBITION ON REQUIRING AUTHORIZA9 TIONS FOR UNDERSEA FIBER OPTIC CABLES
10 PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED BY FEDERAL OR
11 STATE AGENCIES.

"(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other pro-12 13 vision of this Act, the Secretary may not prohibit or require any authorization for the installation, continued 14 presence, operation, maintenance, repair, or recovery of 15 16 undersea fiber optic cables in a national marine sanctuary if a license, lease, or permit issued by a Federal or State 17 18 agency authorizing such installation, continued presence, 19 operation, maintenance, repair, or recovery is in effect.

"(b) INTERAGENCY COOPERATION.—The Secretary
may direct the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to engage in interagency cooperation under section 304(d) in any Federal agency action described in that
section and involving the installation, continued presence,
operation, maintenance, repair, or recovery of undersea
fiber optic cables in a national marine sanctuary.".
